Hawaii State Agency Programs: April 2019

U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, <u>Administration for Community Living</u> Grants

This grant program provides funding to improve state adult protective services. Specifically, funding would be used to enhance APS systems statewide through changes in services and data collection and reporting. It would also target improving states' technical ability to collaborate with ACL's National Adult Maltreatment Reporting System (NAMRS). The deadline to apply is June 24, 2019.

U.S. Department of Interior, <u>U.S. Geological Survey</u>, 2019 Water Use Data and <u>Research Program</u>

The USGS Water-Use Data and Research program (WUDR) will provide financial assistance through cooperative agreements with State water resource agencies to improve the availability, quality, compatibility, and delivery of water-use data that is collected or estimated by States. The deadline to apply is May 31, 2019.

U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, <u>Cooperative Endangered Species Conservation Fund:</u> Traditional Conservation Grants

This program provides funding for species and habitat conservation actions on non-federal lands. Successful applicants must contribute a minimum non-federal match of 25 percent of the estimated program costs of approved projects, or 10 percent when two or more states or territories implement a joint project. The deadline to apply is May 17, 2019.

Fish and Wildlife Service, National Coastal Wetlands Conservation Grant Program

The National Coastal Wetlands Conservation Grant Program assists states acquire, restore, and enhance wetlands in coastal areas. The deadline to apply is June 28, 2019.

U.S. Department of Labor, <u>Employment and Training Administration</u>, <u>Workforce Data Quality Initiative</u>

The Employment and Training Administration (ETA), U.S. Department of Labor (DOL, the Department, or we) announces the availability of grant funds to eligible State Workforce Agencies (SWAs) to support the development or expansion of state

workforce administrative databases. These grants will have a 36 month Period-of–Performance. The deadline to apply is April 24, 2019.

U.S. Department of Labor, <u>Employment and Training Administration</u>, <u>Fidelity</u> Bonding Demonstration Grants

Through the Federal Bonding Program (FBP), the Department of Labor provides fidelity bonds to employers to help reduce the risks of hiring individuals whose criminal backgrounds pose barriers to securing employment. State Workforce Agencies must apply for the grant on behalf of their respective states. The deadline to apply is May 1, 2019.

National Endowment for the Humanities, <u>State Humanities Councils General</u> <u>Operating Support Grants</u>

The National Endowment for the Humanities (NEH) provides general operating support grants to 55 state and jurisdictional humanities councils. The council community helps NEH realize its two primary strategic goals: advancing knowledge and understanding of the humanities and increasing public awareness of, access to, and support for the humanities in the United States. Through grant-making and initiatives state humanities councils make high-quality humanities education and lifelong learning readily available at the state and local level, uniquely tailored to community interests and needs and drawing upon local resources and experiences.

They also help extend the reach of NEH-funded projects and ensure that NEH remains connected to local and regional communities. General Operating Support Grants have a five-year period of performance, with funding provided in years one, two, and three, followed by two subsequent years to complete funded activities. NEH determines annual funding for each state and jurisdictional council according to a legislatively mandated formula. Councils are expected to obligate most of the funds awarded each year by the end of the funding period (November 1 – October 31). The deadline to apply is May 1, 2019.

Department of Transportation, <u>Pipeline and Hazardous Material Safety</u> Administration, One Call Grant

The Pipeline and Hazardous Material Safety Administration (PHMSA) administers this grant program to provide funding for state agencies; damage prevention efforts, including training, changing state underground damage prevention laws, related compliance activities, and public education. The deadline to apply is May 1, 2019.

Department of Transportation, <u>Pipeline and Hazardous Material Safety</u> <u>Administration, State Damage Prevention</u>

The State Damage Prevention (SDP) Program grant provides funding to states that are looking to establish or improve their programs to protect underground pipeline facilities from excavation damage. The deadline to apply is May 1, 2019.

U.S. Department of Transportation, <u>Pipeline and Hazardous Material Safety</u> <u>Administration Hazardous Materials Emergency Preparedness (HMEP) Grant Program</u>

PHMSA, through the U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT), is now accepting applications from States and Territories who are looking to provide public sector employees training and planning for emergency response in transportation. The Hazardous Materials Emergency Preparedness (HMEP) grant program aims to improve the effectiveness in safely and efficiently handling hazardous materials incidents. The deadline to apply is May 24, 2019.
